

Word Study for “Doctrine of Atonement”: Doctrine, Atonement, teach

Doctrine: in Hebrew: *ieqach*: something received, i.e. mentally; instruction (whether on the part of the teacher or hearer); learning, teaching, insight, instruction., thing taught, teaching – power, persuasiveness

Doctrine: in Greek: *diadach*: teaching; that which is taught; instruction;

Atonement in Greek: 2643: *katalage*: exchange, figuratively, adjustment, i.e. restoration to the divine favor; atonement, reconciliation; exchange (of the business of money changers, exchanging equivalent values); adjustment of a difference, reconciliation,

In the NT of the restoration of the favor of God to sinners that repent and put their trust in the expiatory death of Christ

Taught: didasko: 1321 (from Thayer’s Greek Lexicon)

- To hold discourse with others in order to instruct them
- To discharge the office of teacher

Teach: (1828)

- To instruct; to inform; to communicate to another the knowledge of that of which he was before ignorant
- To deliver any doctrine, principles or words for instruction
- To show; exhibit
