Word Study: "Preserveth," "Preserve," "Sustain," & "Maintain"

Preserveth: shamar in Hebrew

Keep, watch, guard, protect, build a fence around

Watchman; preserve; be on one's guard;

To hedge about

Guard; to protect, attend, observe,

Preserve:

To keep or maintain in an unaltered condition
Keep in safety and protect from harm, decay, loss or destruction
To prevent from rotting or corruption or decomposition
Maintain in safety from injury, harm, or danger
To defend from evil
To uphold; sustain; maintain

Sustain:


To give support
To supply with sustenance
Nourish
Uphold; buoy up
to admit as valid
Confirm; support by adequate proof
To keep from falling
To maintain

Maintain:


To preserve or keep in a particular state or condition
To support; to sustain;
Not to suffer to fail or decline
To keep
To defend
To support by assertion or argument; to affirm
Make sure that something stays at the same standard or level
To keep in an existing state
Uphold as true; justify; firmness of conviction




Elisha Timeline
